Keynote Speaker 138th Annual Meeting of The Connecticut Conference

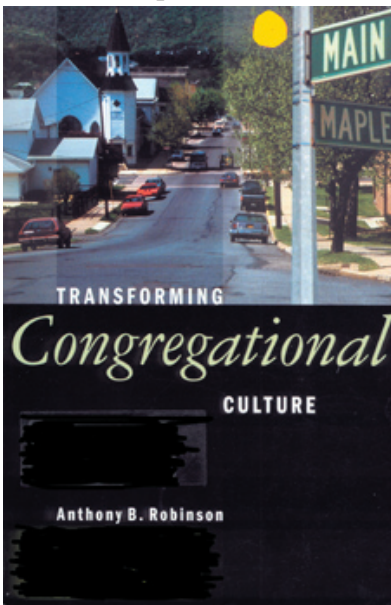
October 21-22 at Kennedy High School in Waterbury

Robinson’s pastoral experience includes serving four congregations, in both rural and urban settings, small and large, multi-cultural and multi-racial as well as primarily Euro-American. In 2004, he completed 14 years at Plymouth Congregational Church (UCC) in Seattle. During his ministry he has been active in interfaith dialogue, refugee resettlement, and ministries in low-income housing.
